FNGLISH

Students will be exploring and engaging with persuasive texts and their features this term. They will deconstruct persuasive texts in particular 'Click, Clack, Moo, Cows that Type' and 'How Santa Got His Job.' Students will deconstruct the cultural and social text levels of persuasive texts. Students will continue to develop their understanding of language conventions, spelling strategies, grammar and sentence structure when writing within these text types. Students will be actively working to develop comprehension and reading strategies through a range of independent and small group activities.

MATHEMATICS

Students will recall multiplication facts up to 10×10 and related division facts, develop efficient mental and written strategies and use appropriate digital technologies for multiplication and for division where there is no remainder. Students will compare the areas of regular and irregular shapes by informal means and use simple scales, legends and directions to interpret information contained in basic maps. Students will investigate equivalent fractions used in contexts, count by quarters halves and thirds, including with mixed numerals. They will locate and represent these fractions on a number line. Students will recognise that the place value system can be extended to tenths and hundredths. And they will make connections between fractions and decimal notation.

RELIGION

Students will develop their understanding of God's Word in Scripture as the use the Bible's referencing system to locate books, people, places and things in the Bible and engage with a variety of books and text types in the Old and New Testament.

Students begin to appreciate the significance of community for Christians: of living in a loving relationship with Gog, others and all of creation. They develop their understanding of community through an exploration of different texts.

MUSIC – Mrs Joy Dawson

In term 3 Year 4 will be learning about two different forms of music. The first form is Binary form (AB sections) and Ternary form (ABA sections). Students will learn to compose a short tune in Binary and Ternary form using G, A and B notes and write them on the Music Staff. Students will practise notes G, A and B on the recorder and will be introduced to the note C
